Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

DSA is a fund that can provide additional support and assistive technology to support undergraduates or postgraduates at university. The university student support service can guide students through the process.

Currently DSA requests evidence of a disability. For neurodevelopmental conditions it will ask for a medical practitioner to provide a post-16 diagnostic report. If a person's mental health has been impacted for 12 months or longer, it is possible to obtain support on this basis. Please ask your GP to complete this form.

Health Services

Adult Neurodevelopmental Service

The Adult Neurodevelopmental Service is a specialist service consisting of a highly skilled multidisciplinary team responsible for the assessment and diagnosis of autism and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD).

Eligibility Criteria

You would be eligible for the service if you:

- are registered with a GP in Coventry or Warwickshire
- are over the age of 18 years for either an autism or a dual neurodevelopmental (autism and ADHD) assessment, OR over the age of 17 years for an ADHD only assessment
- have no known learning disability
- are not currently under the care of Acute or Community Mental Health Services

You are not eligible for an autism assessment with our service if you have been previously diagnosed with autism. You are not eligible for an ADHD assessment with our service if you have previously had a diagnosis of ADHD.

Please speak to your GP about a referral to the Neurodevelopmental Service. Your GP will ask you to complete a brief questionnaire, an AQ10 for autism and an ASRS for ADHD. Both are available on the internet. The GP will also need to include the impact of the suspected autism or ADHD which will give us more information about your difficulties.
